### FROM THE PRESIDENT'S DESK

This past March *Judy Troiano* was posthumously awarded the Bimini Bahamas Community Service Award. The award was given "in recognition of valuable contributions to the ongoing veterinarian health of Bimini's animals, especially the care of Bimini's canines". The award was given by Preston Cunnigham, Administrator of Bimini and J. Lamoreere Rolle, Chief Councilor of Bimini.

Judy began the Bimini Love Program several years ago after visiting Bimini and experiencing first hand the problems that this island had with their feral dogs. She was appalled that the only answer to the over population of dogs was to round them up at given times and shoot them. Since the islanders fed these "pot cake" dogs they were easy prey for the bounty hunter. Occasionally a persons' pet would be mistaken for a pot cake and shot. Judy decided to take matters into her own hands and was able to set up a spay/neuter program run by All Paws Rescue and veterinarians who would volunteer their time. This was no small effort on her part.

After Judy passed in July 2000, *Consie Von Gontard* volunteered to keep this program going.
